## The VZ Technical Library

The main thrust behind my creation of the VZ Technical Library (T.L.) was to centralise all information about the VZ and then provide that information free (wherever possible) to any User who requests that information. ArchiVZ is one means by which to distribute free information.

The one request I make is that YOU cover the postage costs of any information you require. I shall cover the costs of producing **ArchiVZ**.

Please note that software is deemed to be free once the authors permission has been granted. Thus you need not worry about any Software Piracy issues.

In the case of Dick Smith Electronics, it is known that they bought the copyright of all software sold. They have written to me indicating that they have no problems with me distributing any program.
